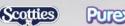

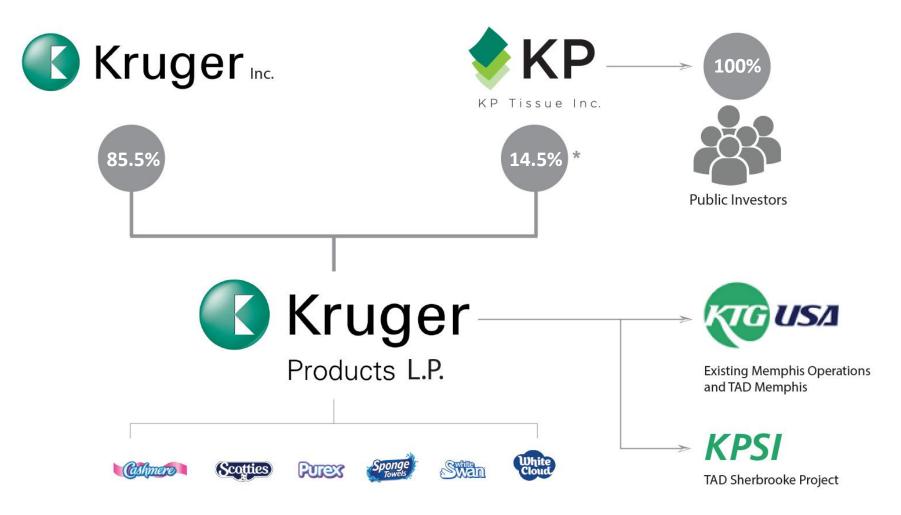

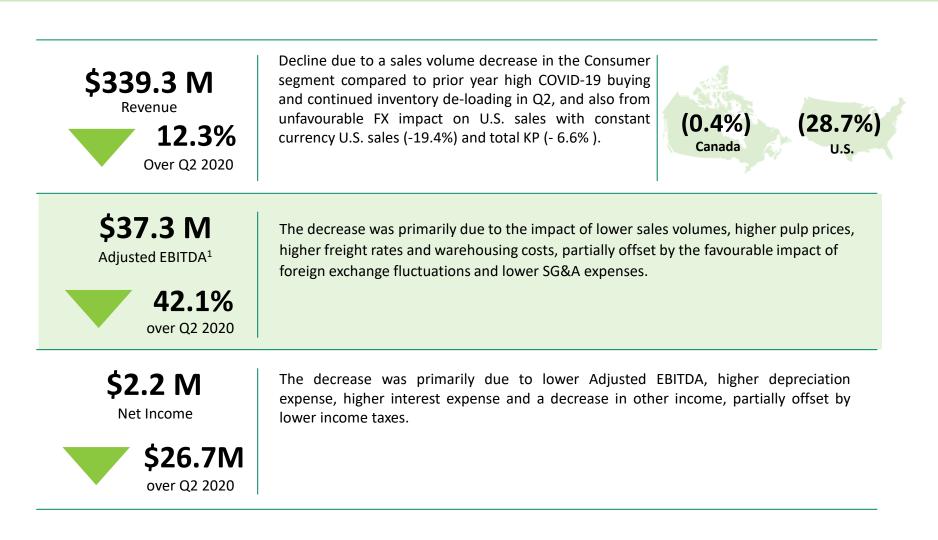
### **Kruger Products Overview**

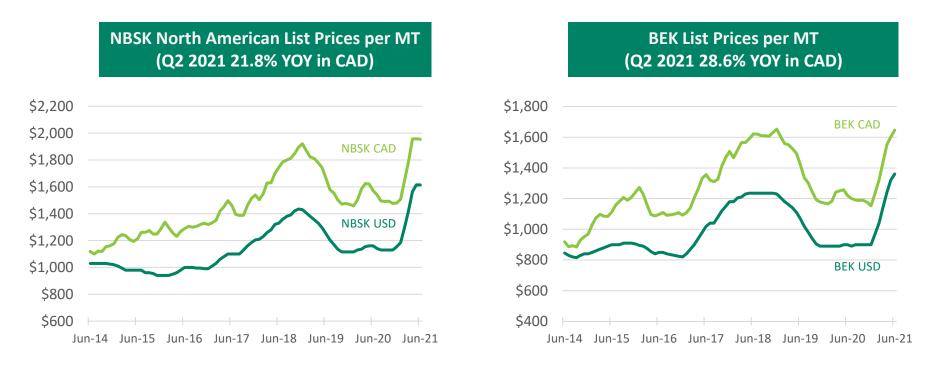

## **Pulp Input Prices**



Q2 2021 NBSK average prices in CAD increased 18.7% and BEK average prices increased 20.2% compared to Q1 2021.

NBSK average prices in USD have increased 22.8% and BEK average prices increased 24.4% quarter-overquarter in Q2 2021. Based on industry forecasts, both NBSK and BEK prices are expected to moderate but remain at historically high levels for the remainder of the year.

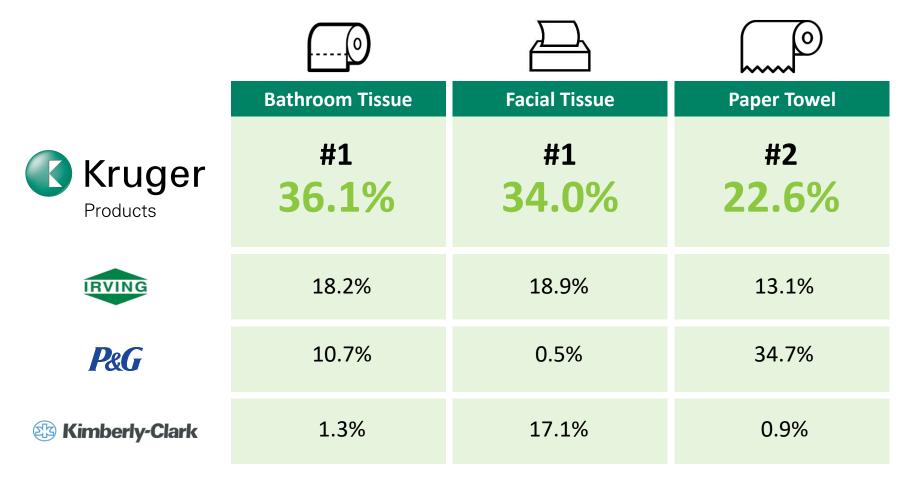

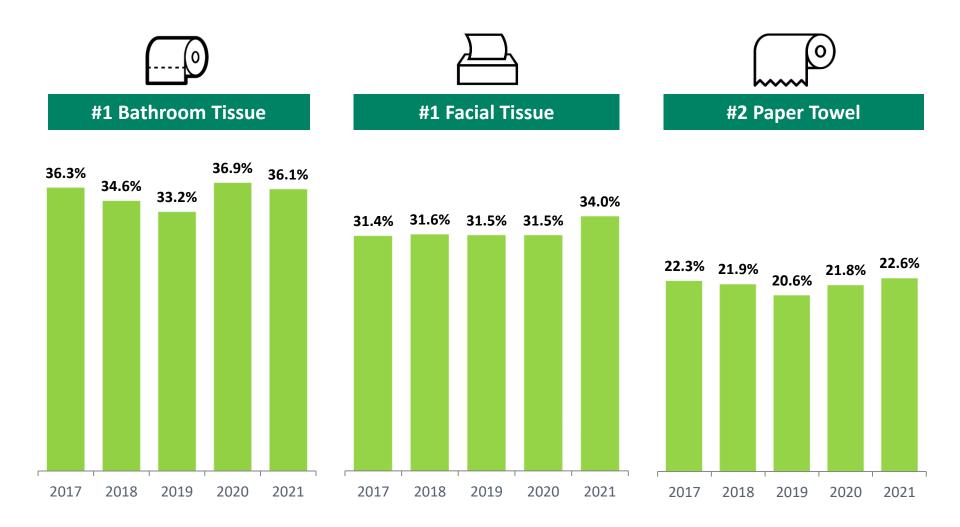

# AFH SEGMENT

### **Performance Tied to End-Market Recovery**

- In-sourcing of paper capacity in Q2 2021 lowered outsourcing costs
- Volume continued to improve sequentially with easing COVID-19 restrictions. Total cases sold were flat compared to Q2 2020 but remained approximately 25% below pre-pandemic levels
- Volume has steadily improved month-over-month during 2021. Canadian end-user market recovery lagging the U.S. by several months
- Operations continues to perform well and the business is well prepared for ongoing recovery
- Price increase negotiations underway and will flow to P&L with contract renewals

# Q2 2021 Revenue Compared to Q2 2020





#### Impacted due to a combination of:

- Sales volume decrease in the Consumer segment due to:
  - Comparison to high COVID-19 buying activity in Q2 2020
  - De-stocking of tissue inventories by retailers and consumers in Q2 2021
- Unfavourable FX on U.S. sales (in constant currency, total KP and U.S. revenue decreased by 6.6% and 19.4%)
- Sales volume in the AFH segment was flat to Q2 2020 with continued COVID-19 restrictions



# Q2 2021 Adjusted EBITDA<sup>1</sup> Compared to Q2 2020





### Primarily due to the following factors:

- Lower sales volume
- Unfavourable impact of higher pulp prices
- Increase in freight rates and warehousing costs

### Partially offset by:

- Favourable net impact of FX
- Lower SG&A expenses

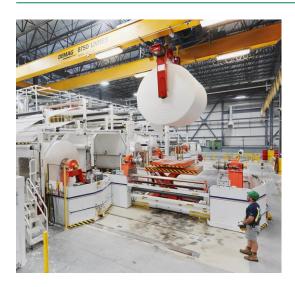


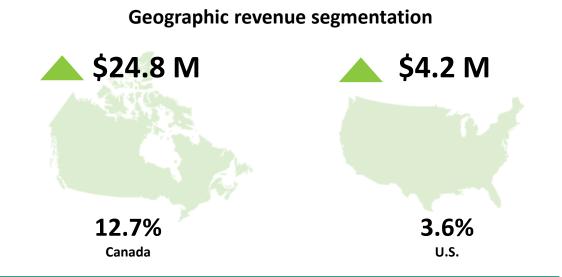

#### Increase due to a combination of:

- Higher Consumer and AFH sales volume
- Offset somewhat by: Negative FX impact on U.S. sales (in constant currency, total KP and U.S. revenue increased by 10.9% and 6.8%)





# Q2 2021 Adjusted EBITDA<sup>1</sup> Compared to Q1 2021





### Variance due to the following factors:

- Higher Consumer and AFH sales volume
- Higher AFH contribution
- Favourable F/X

### More than offset by:

- Lower Consumer contribution
- Higher pulp prices
- Increased freight and warehousing costs
- Higher advertising spending

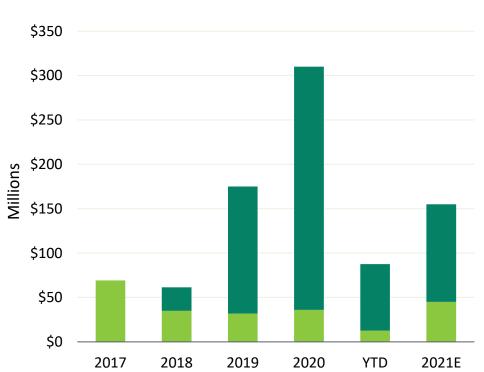

- In April, \$135 million of 8-Yr Senior Unsecured Notes were issued and the outstanding balance on the Senior Credit facility was reduced with part of the proceeds
- In May, the financing for the Sherbrooke Expansion was completed and \$27 million of convertible debentures were issued
- Total debt also increased related to the financing for Capital Investments in TAD Sherbrooke
- Net debt increased by approximately \$32 million overall including the impact of higher working capital
- Leverage increased due to the higher level of net debt and decreasing LTM Adjusted EBITDA

CAPEX

- YTD 2021 TAD Sherbrooke CAPEX was \$75 million
- YTD 2021 CAPEX excluding TAD Sherbrooke was \$12.6 million
- 2021 TAD Sherbrooke CAPEX estimated at approximately \$110 million
- Total 2021 CAPEX of \$150-\$160 million
