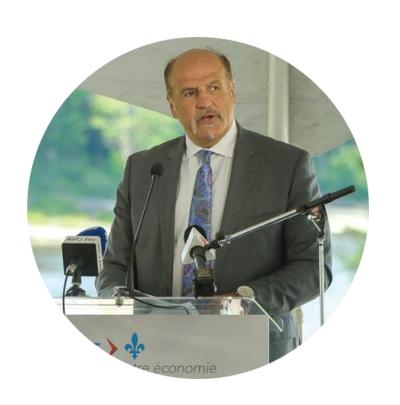

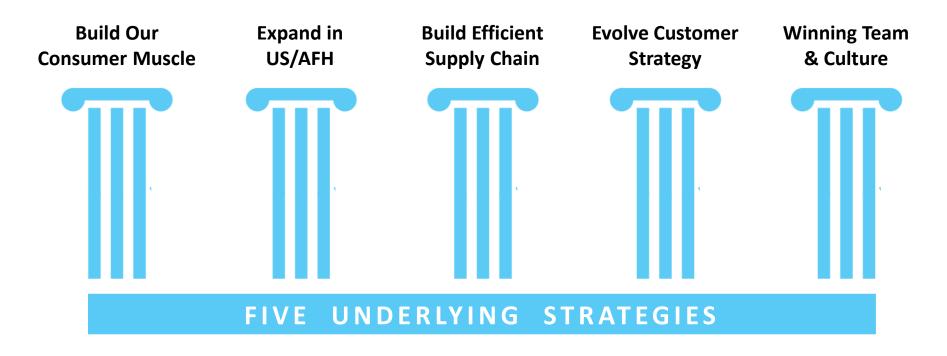

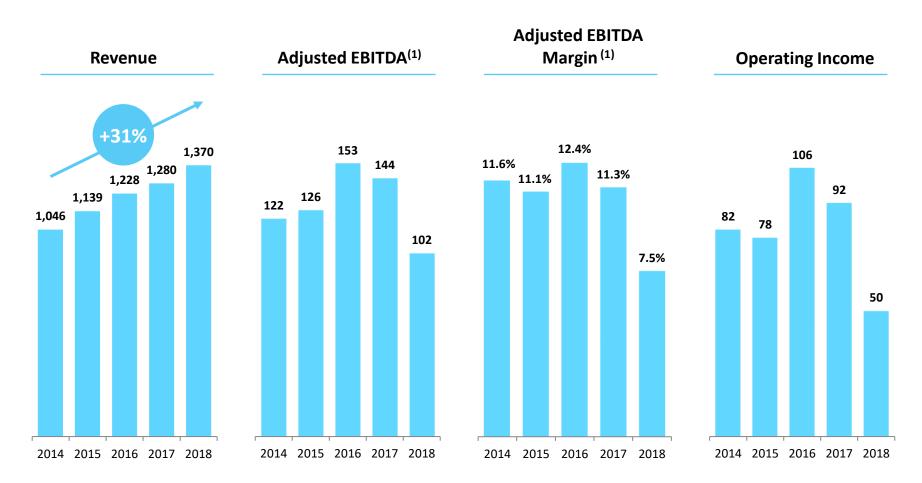

(in C\$ millions)



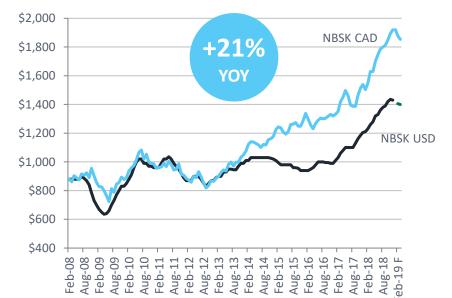

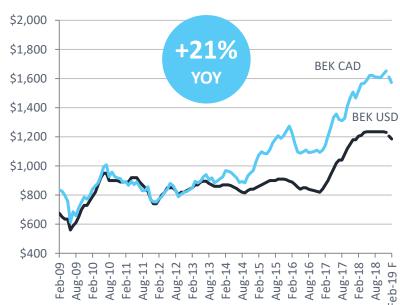

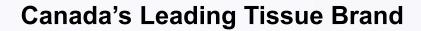
Data within this unique index is derived from actual freight invoices paid on behalf of Cass' clients. The index uses January 2005 as its base month.

Away-From-Home (AFH) Segment



- AFH sells commercial tissue products primarily through distributors to businesses involved in property management, health care, food service, manufacturing and lodging, and to other public facilities
- Market leader in Canada with a market share of approximately 30% and expanding our presence in the U.S. across multiple segments
- AFH revenue was \$231.1 million in Fiscal 2018, a decrease of 0.9%
- Adjusted EBITDA was negative \$12.8 million, due to higher pulp and freight costs, a competitive environment and outsourcing costs
- AFH absorbs high portion of KPLP fixed costs



















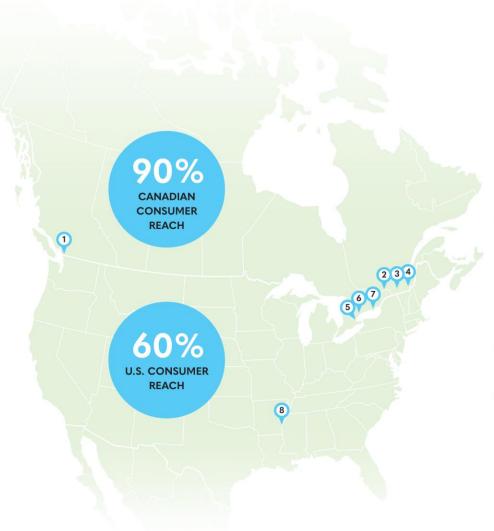

- Site location in Sherbrooke, Quebec in the Brompton area
- Total cost of C\$575 million
- Anticipate output of approximately 70,000 metric tonnes per year
- Designed to allow paper towels to be manufactured at very high speeds
- Project is central to our long-term North American growth strategy in the ultra-premium tissue segment

- Financial return of project driven by:
 - new volume
 - capitalizing on the expanded towel manufacturing capability
 - creating manufacturing efficiencies with TAD1 machine for the U.S. market
- Construction of facility started in April 2019
- Start-up expected in early 2021

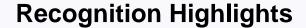
