

*As of November 5, 2020 (14.8% as of September 30, 2020).


Kruger Products Overview



Pulp Input Prices



Q3 2020 NBSK prices in CAD decreased 6.1% and BEK prices decreased 4.0% compared to Q2 2020.

NBSK prices in USD have slightly decreased while BEK prices remained the same during Q3 2020. For the remainder of 2020 and based on industry forecasts, NBSK and BEK prices in USD are expected to increase slightly.



(USD average 1.33 in Q3 2020 compared to 1.32 in Q2 2020)

COVID-19 Impact





- Enhanced our safety protocols in wake of wave 2
- Strong performance of assets with no major disruptions
- Running fewer SKUs with priority on top selling products leading to improved productivity
- Extended our raw material purchases to secure business continuity
- Consumer trust in our brand is a key differentiator in period of uncertainty leading to further market share gain

TAD SHERBROOKE

Site construction near completion

- On time and on budget
- All converting lines are operational and performing well
- Trying to exceed planned production to meet increased demand
- \$2.1 million in start-up costs incurred in Q3
- Paper machine remains on track for Q1 2021 start-up
- Strong demand is anticipated for this output across North American customers

BEX

Driving more capacity, asset reliability, cost savings and cultural shift

- OpEx program tracking to overall plan and rolled out to all sites
- High level of employee engagement and culture shift in motion
- Plants operating very well in Q3
- SKU consolidation helped run more efficiently and increased output and productivity
- Lower manufacturing costs YoY
- Investing more in enhanced maintenance to drive stronger asset performance
- By the end of 2020, expect to reach the top-end of \$15-20 million target in cost savings on a run rate basis.





Canada's Leading Tissue Company



AFH SEGMENT

Doing the right things to rebuild the business

- Market conditions remain challenging for Foodservice, Lodging and Property Management
- End-user consumption has improved from Q2 but stabilized at 15% to 20% below prior year volume
- Heightened focus on hand hygiene has kept towel volume strong despite market conditions
- Migration shift to selling consumer-like products in retail outlets
- OpEx continues to drive improved productivity but has created headroom with soft demand
- Strong consumer demand requiring more outsourcing at AFH




Q3 2020 Revenue Compared to Q3 2019





Impacted due to a combination of:


- Strong volume increases in Canada and the U.S. primarily related to COVID-19 demand
- Partially offset by lower AFH revenue impacted by COVID-19

Q3 2020 Adjusted EBITDA¹ Compared to Q3 2019





Primarily due to the following factors:

- Favourable sales impact and mix
- Lower pulp costs
- Benefits of the OpEx program
- Reduced number of SKUs

Partially offset by:

- Increased SG&A costs
- Higher manufacturing costs related to COVID-19
- Higher freight and warehousing costs
- Increased outsourcing costs

Q3 2020 Revenue Compared to Q2 2020







Decrease due to a combination of:


- Lower volume in U.S. Consumer segment following significant Q2 demand spike
- U.S. Consumer segment contractual selling prices tied to pulp moderating lower
- Unfavourable F/X rate on U.S. sales
- Partially offset by slightly higher sales in Canadian Consumer segment

Q3 2020 Adjusted EBITDA¹ Compared to Q2 2020





Due to the following factors:

- Lower sales in U.S. Consumer segment following significant Q2 demand spike
- Higher SG&A expenses related to increased advertising spend
- Higher negative Adjusted EBITDA from AFH
- TAD Sherbrooke start-up costs

CAPEX





CAPEX, excluding TAD Sherbrooke Facility

- Q3 and YTD 2020 TAD Sherbrooke CAPEX was \$65.1 million and \$201.3 million.
- \$43.3 million of accrued and unpaid capital spending at quarter-end
- 2020 TAD Sherbrooke CAPEX estimated at between \$300 and \$320 million
- Q3 2020 CAPEX excluding TAD Sherbrooke was \$5.3 million
- 2020 regular CAPEX estimated at \$30-\$40 million range
- Total 2020 CAPEX of \$330-\$360 million

Our focus going forward will be on:

- Continuing to drive consumer revenue growth
- Investing in our brands to build market share leadership in Canada while expanding White Cloud in the U.S.
- Completing the TAD Sherbrooke facility, successful start-up and aggressive sales plan
- Creating a more efficient and capable supply chain network with benefits and progress of OpEx program
- Doing the right things to improve AFH performance considering slow recovery in end-user markets
- Developing our organizational capability to drive growth for the future
