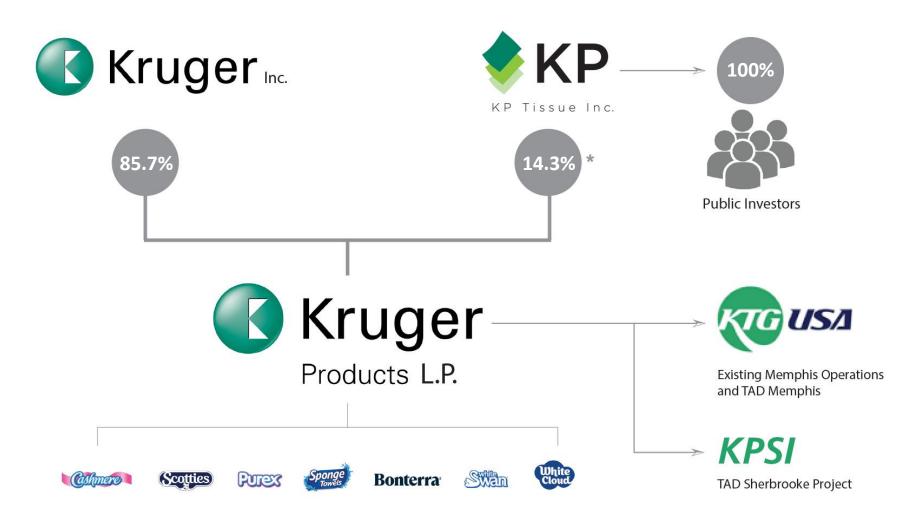

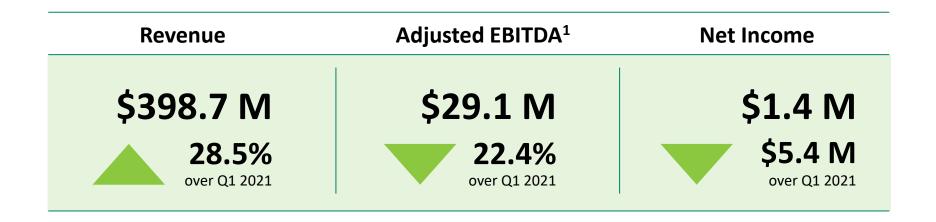

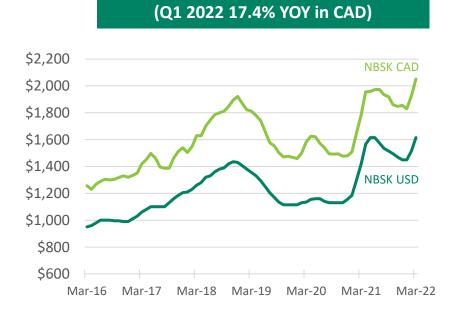

### **Pulp Input Prices**

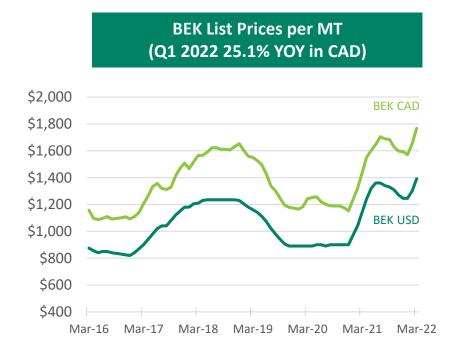


Q1 2022 NBSK average prices<sup>1</sup> in CAD increased 4.4%, while BEK average prices<sup>1</sup> increased 3.5% compared to Q4 2021.

Q1 2022 NBSK average prices<sup>1</sup> in CAD increased 17.4% and BEK average prices<sup>1</sup> increased 25.1% year-over-year. Based on industry forecasts for 2022, NBSK and BEK prices are expected to remain at elevated levels but continue to be volatile.

#### **TAD Sherbrooke**

- Continues to exceed ramp-up plans
- Phase 1 of AI implementation successful. Phase 2 in progress with new use cases to be delivered

#### **Sherbrooke Expansion (Doubling capacity)**

- ~\$110 million for double-wide paper machine with 60,000 MT capacity
- Increased total investment to ~\$350 million
- Financing secured
- Bathroom tissue line expected in Q1 2023
- Start-up dates for other product lines in 2023-24
- Customer sell-in underway



NETWORK MODERNIZATION

#### **New Facial Tissue Line in Memphis**

- Start-up pushed to Q3 2022 (global supply-chain issues)
- Capable of producing both TAD and LDC products
- Provides opportunity for future growth in the U.S.

#### **Memphis Operations**

- Labour challenges continuing to affect productivity in first half of year
- Staff availability improving, but many new employees undergoing training
- Accelerating maintenance investments on assets
- Improvements expected in Q3 2022
- Leveraging other plants to offset production shortfall



# **Investing in Innovation and Marketing to Support Brands**

- Strong distribution across customer base for newly launched, sustainable Bonterra
- Cashmere and Purex UltraLuxe TAD upgrade tracking well against expectations
- SpongeTowels UltraPro continues to drive share with consumers
- Expanding distribution of relaunched White Cloud in the United States
- KPLP up more than 2.0 share points in key eCommerce accounts

# Adjusted EBITDA Margin<sup>1</sup>



#### Decrease primarily due to the following factors:

- Higher pulp prices and other inflation
- Unfavourable impacts of overhead absorption
- Labour shortages in Memphis manufacturing
- Higher freight rates

#### Partially offset by:

- Higher sales volume
- Selling price increases

#### Variance due to:

- Lower sales volume
- Higher pulp costs and inflation
- Increased freight costs
- Labour challenges in Memphis
- Increased overhead absorption
- Loss on foreign exchange

#### Partially offset by:

- Lower advertising
- Selling price increases in Consumer US and AFH

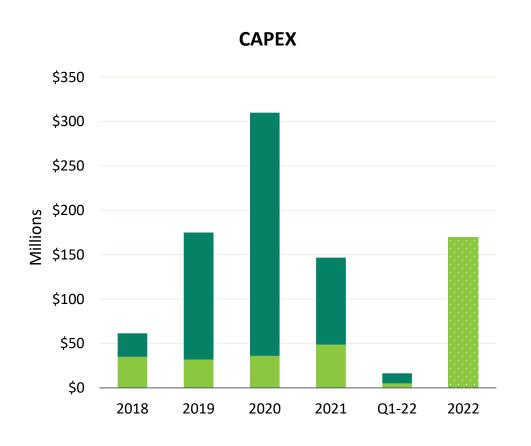

- Total debt increased \$16.6 million compared to Q4 2021 primarily due to working capital increases.
- Leverage increased due to the higher level of net debt from a lower cash position and lower LTM Adjusted EBITDA.

#### **CAPEX**





- Q1 2022 CAPEX reached \$16.3 million, including \$5.3 million related to TAD Sherbrooke Project and \$6.0 million related to Sherbrooke Expansion Project
- Total 2022 CAPEX forecast reduced to \$160-\$180 million, including Sherbrooke Expansion Project
