

CORPORATE STRUCTURE¹







PULP INPUT PRICES

Q1 2023 NBSK average prices¹ in CAD decreased 3.6%, and BEK average prices¹ decreased 7.0% from Q4 2022.

Q1 2023 NBSK average prices¹ in CAD increased 10.3% and BEK average prices¹ increased 15.3% year-over-year. Based on industry forecasts for 2023, pulp prices are expected to remain volatile but trend downwards, weakening Canadian dollar will temper decline.



(CAD/USD averaged 1.35 in Q1 2023, up 7% from Q1 2022)



INFLATION, PRICING AND COST MANAGEMENT

Inflation

- · Inflation has slowed but still above prior year
- Up 4-6% compared to Q1 2022


Pricing

- All announced pricing has been implemented
- Continuing to monitor market pricing to remain competitive

Cost Management

- · Cost management initiatives ongoing
- Targeting CAPEX, inventory, productivity and discretionary spending





SHERBROOKE OPERATIONS AND EXPANSION

- TAD operations continue to exceed ramp-up curve, including paper machine capacity improvement
- Bathroom tissue line start-up surpassing expectations
- Implementation of facial line (Q4 2023) and paper machine line (end of 2024) tracking to plan, but closely watching supply chain and inflation
- Phase 3 of AI implementation ongoing for supply chain improvements





MEMPHIS OPERATIONS

- Shutdown of legacy assets completed as planned
- Focusing on high-quality TAD and facial products
- New facial line production above expectations, now deploying digital twin tool
- TAD operations continuing to improve sequentially
- Recovery enabling improved cost structure




FOCUSED BRAND SUPPORT




Q1 2023 REVENUE COMPARED TO Q1 2022

\$50.0M in Q1 2023 compared to \$29.1M in Q1 2022

Increase primarily due to the following factors:

- Higher selling prices versus Q1 2022
- · Favourable sales mix for Consumer segment
- Memphis plant cost recovery
- Lower freight rates

Partially offset by:

- Significant inflation on pulp and other input costs
- · Lower sales volume in Consumer segment
- Higher warehousing and SG&A expenses
- Unfavourable FX impact

Q1 2023 REVENUE COMPARED TO Q4 2022

(\$7.1 M) Q1 Revenue decrease

> (1.6%) over Q4 2022


Sequential decrease in revenue due to:

- Seasonally lower volume in AFH segment
- Lower volume in Consumer segment in the U.S.
- Slightly negative FX impact on U.S. dollar sales





Q1 2023 ADJUSTED EBITDA¹ COMPARED TO Q4 2022



\$50.0M in Q1 2023 compared to \$44.4M in Q4 2022

Variance due to:

- Favourable sales mix
- Lower freight and warehousing costs
- Memphis plant cost recovery
- Reduced energy costs

Partially offset by:

- Lower sales volume
- Higher SG&A expenses


