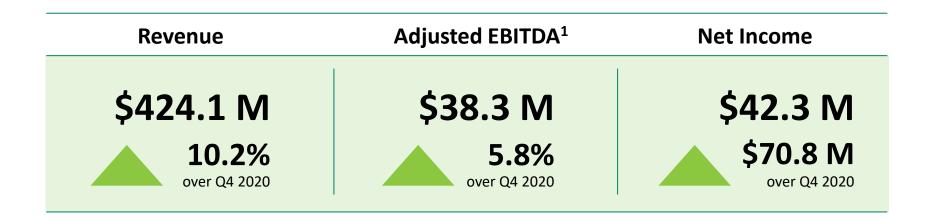

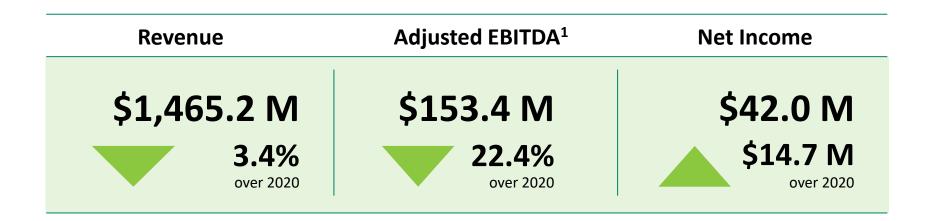

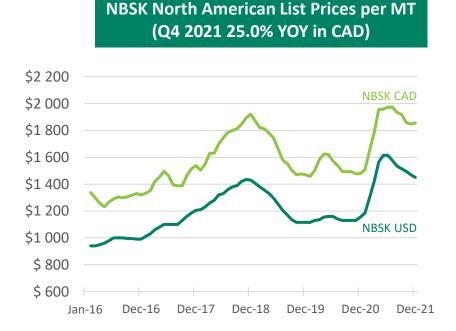

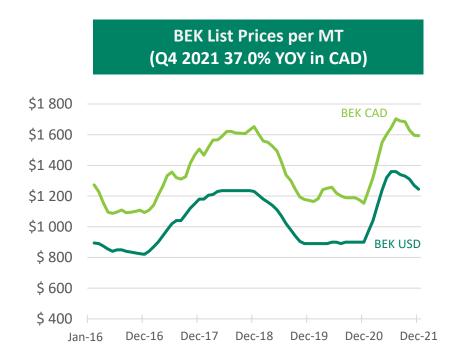
Pulp Input Prices



Q4 2021 NBSK average prices¹ in CAD decreased 4.6%, while BEK average prices¹ decreased 5.1% compared to Q3 2021.

Q4 2021 NBSK average prices¹ in CAD increased 25.0% and BEK average prices¹ increased 37.0% year-over-year. Based on industry forecasts for 2022, NBSK and BEK prices are expected to remain at elevated levels but continue to be volatile.

TAD Sherbrooke

Sherbrooke Expansion (Doubling capacity)

- Additional investment of ~\$110 million for doublewide, LDC machine with 60,000 MT capacity
- Increased total investment to ~\$350 million
- Financing secured
- Start-up dates from 2022-2024 for product lines
- Customer sell-in underway

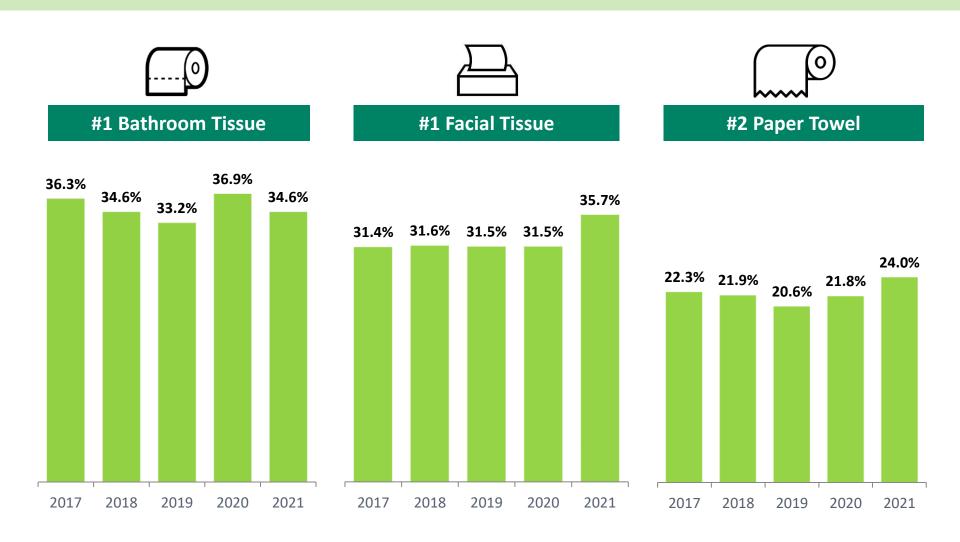

Recovery ongoing in commercial sector

 Market recovery continued in Q4 2021 with volume approximately 15% better than Q4 2020 and 5% below pre-COVID volume levels (Q4 2019)

Recovery in the U.S. still outpacing Canada

Price increases announced in Q4 2021 effective on Jan. 1st

• Inflation on raw materials and transportation costs escalated in Q4 2021; further incremental price increases to offset inflation being implemented

Adjusted EBITDA Margin¹



Increase primarily due to the following factors:

- Higher sales volume
- Selling price increase in Consumer Canada
- Lower SG&A expenses
- Net favourable impact of FX fluctuations

Partially offset by:

- Unfavourable impact of sales mix
- Higher pulp prices and other inflation
- Labour challenges in Memphis manufacturing
- Higher freight rates and warehousing costs

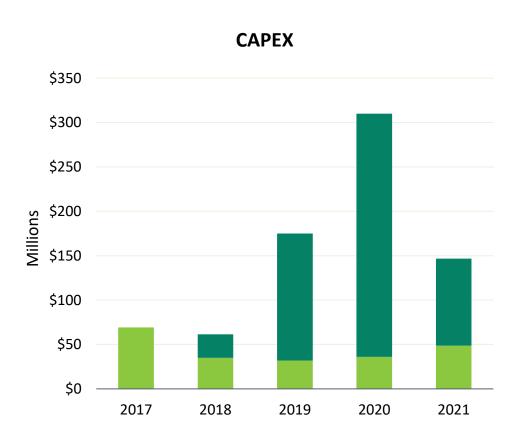

- Total debt increased \$14.6 million compared to Q3 2021 primarily due to funding for the TAD Sherbrooke Project.
- Leverage decreased due to the lower level of net debt from a higher cash position and slightly higher LTM Adjusted EBITDA.

CAPEX





- 2021 TAD Sherbrooke CAPEX was \$98.0 million
- \$6.9 million of accrued and unpaid capital spending at year-end
- 2021 CAPEX was \$48.6 million, excluding TAD Sherbrooke
- Total 2022 CAPEX between \$190-\$210 million, including Sherbrooke Expansion project
